



Re-naming of Jelita Bangsa in Jurong Shipyard

Jurong Shipyard, a subsidiary of Sembcorp Marine, and Trada Group of Indonesia celebrated the re-naming of tanker Jelita Bangsa (Ex-Atlantic Hero) on December 16, 2009 following the ship's successful repair completion in the yard.

Owned by Trada's subsidiary PT Trada Shipping and managed by PT Trada Maritime, the 96,687 dwt tanker, which measures 232.042m x 42.00m x 20.30m, called at Jurong Shipyard during the month of December for cargo tank heating coils renewal and numerous deck-fitting jobs including renewal of support brackets, railings, platforms, foundations and control boxes. The repairs also encompassed piping works in several locations, including the tanks, engine room, and on deck as well

as the overhaul of valves, main engine and its associated equipment and other machineries including auxiliary boiler, exhaust gas economizer, cargo oil pump turbines, inert gas fans, and atmospheric condenser retubing works. Routine underwater drydocking works and electric & automation works were also carried out.

Mr Lee Yeok Hoon, Executive Director of Jurong Shipyard, said: "The Jelita Bangsa is the first docking repair job that Jurong Shipyard is undertaking for the Trada Group. My sincere thanks to Trada Group for giving us this opportunity. We hope that this is the new beginning of a growing business relationship of close co-operation and positive synergy for both our organisations."

The re-naming of Jelita Bangsa was officiated by Lady Sponsor Mrs Maera Hanafiah, the wife of Mr Ad Hanafiah, Chairman of Trada Group, in a ceremony in Jurong Shipyard witnessed by key stakeholders.
